## George Family Foundation awards \$980,000 in latest grant round

Annual giving tops \$4.4 million for 2019

**MINNEAPOLIS** (Feb. 4, 2020) – The George Family Foundation announced today that it has expanded support for individual leadership programs, faith-based social justice efforts and youth development programs in the Twin Cities; Dallas, Texas; Oakland, California; and the Vail Valley in Colorado. The Foundation has also continued to support the general operations of many long-term partners.

The Foundation awarded \$980,000 to 38 organizations, bringing its total giving for 2019 to \$4,434,700.

In this grant round, the Foundation joins others in supporting the Itasca Project's new Minnesota Young American Leaders Program, which is modeled on a highly successful program at the Harvard Business School and offers mentorship and training for up to 60 emerging leaders in Minnesota each year. The Foundation is also funding a pilot program that provides training in authentic leadership at Teach For All while renewing a commitment to the Wenda Weekes Moore Internship and Dr. Reatha Clark King Fellowship at the Women's Foundation of Minnesota.

The Foundation is expanding its work in the faith-based social justice field through a new grant to ISAIAH that will support the Greater Than Fear program.

"To address the state's polarized political environment, ISAIAH has been advancing a narrative that resists appeals to racism and inspires Minnesotans to support collective action through democratic politics. We developed the structural elements of this narrative in 2017-18, deployed it aggressively in 2018," said Minister JaNaé Bates, communications director of ISAIAH. "These needed resources from the George Family Foundation will allow us to refine it for 2020 and beyond. This is an exciting opportunity to animate the best version of Minnesotans and embolden us toward a caring economy and robust, multiracial democracy where we can all thrive."

The Foundation also announced new grants to youth development organizations, including Cookie Cart, Urban Strategies, Inc. and Junior Players Dallas, as well as increased grants to YouthPower365 in the Vail Valley. This grantmaking round includes \$580,000 in general operating support to 25 organizations.

Founded by Penny and Bill George in 1994, the <u>George Family Foundation</u> is a \$60 million private family foundation that supports integrative health and healing, authentic leadership, spirituality & mindfulness, youth development, the environment and community.
